REMEMBERING OUR PAST Part V

We continue to share some recollections about the history of our Parish. Today we publish some of the personal reflections and experiences of TONY SANTOS, an original member of Our Lady of Good Counsel Parish and former Mayor of San Leandro.

"We have lived in Marina Faire for the past 53 years and I recall when the parish was started. Father Keane was our first pastor and mass was held at either the Mulford Gardens Club house or the Blue Dolphin Restaurant until the church was built. We have had a great group of priests, from Keane to Ferreira to Snyder, Autard, Nguyen and now Fr. Jan.

Father Ferreira presided over both my Dad's and mother's funerals. My parents lived on Bermuda for a number of years and my sister on Trinidad. All of us were members of the church. Both my children were confirmed at the Church and my son was an "altar" boy for several years.

Father Autard nominated me to be the "Catholic Man of the Year" in 1989. On May 27, 1989, I was presented with the "MSGR Philipp J. Ryan" "Catholic Man of the Year" award. I have had the award hanging on my wall in my office for all of the past years. I was also happy to assist Father Nguyen in having the hall completed in a timely manner. I interceded with staff to make certain the Church had all the necessary assistance in completing the project in a timely manner. And as I recall, everything went smoothly.

I believe I am the only member of the parish who served on the San Leandro City Council;

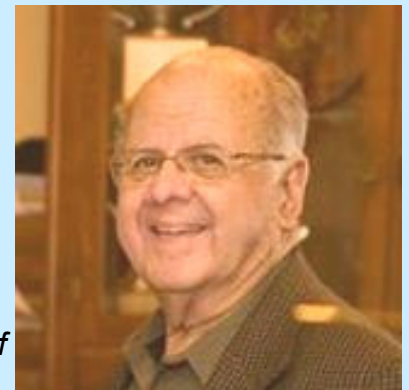

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

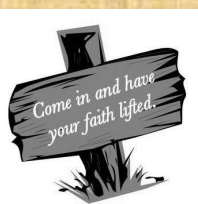
Some say tomato—and some say tomahto—you know the old song. What do you say when you arrive at church and see a font prepared, a baby in the wings, the paschal candle burning? Well, maybe you will say that “we’re having a baptism today,” or maybe you say “we are having a christening.” The proper term is baptism, since that is the name of the sacrament. But the persistent use of “christening” in our culture, probably from due to the influence of the Episcopal Church, is interesting.

Baptism, an ancient word, is from the Greek meaning to dip or to dunk. Christening is an Old English word that describes perfectly well that more than getting splashed with water, the person being baptized is being “Christ-ed.” No matter what you call it, there’s always water involved, and then an anointing with chrism—fragrant olive oil consecrated as a sign of Christ’s presence—poured upon the brow as we say, “As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life.”

So, in being Christ-ed, you are conformed to his image, your life is expected to be a retelling of his life in miniature and you—even though you may be squirming or sleeping—are commissioned to be a priest, a prophet, a king. This means that you are called to be one who worships, you are called to speak the truth, you are called to shape the world and exercise right judgment. That is the deepest treasure of our tradition, and every time you gather to celebrate a baptism, you renew your vows precisely so that you can be more “Christ-ed.” No matter what vocabulary you assign to the liturgy, the key is transformation of the human person in the community of the Body of Christ.

Q. Is St. Christopher still a saint?

A. St. Christopher is still recognized as a saint, though his feast day no longer appears on the Church’s universal liturgical calendar. He was one of the early martyrs about whom not much is known. His name means “Christ-bearer,” which reflects the story told of him that he carried the child Jesus across a river. Because so little is known of Christopher, he may have been known only by his story and people gave him a name that reflected the story. Canonizations arose centuries after Christopher’s time. Many of the early saints, including Christopher, were never formally canonized but were acclaimed as saints by Christian communities. In recent decades the Church has removed the feast days of obscure saints from the universal liturgical calendar, but the saints still remain saints, and their feast days may still be observed by parishes bearing their name and by those with a continuing devotion to the saint.

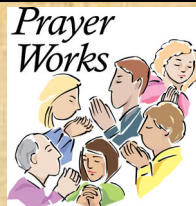
