LETTER FROM THE BISHOP

On Saturday, May 20th, six of our young adult parishioners received the Sacrament of Confirmation at the Cathedral of Christ the Light in Oakland. Subsequently, Bishop Barber sent us a letter expressing his gratitude and the assurance of his prayer and blessing. And this is what he wrote:

“Dear Father Jan,

I would like to express my gratitude to you and the community of Our Lady of Good Counsel for coming to our Cathedral of Christ the Light for the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation. In a special way I thank you for all your efforts in the evangelization of the Our Lady of Good Counsel Community.

Please extend my sincere appreciation to all those involved in the catechetical preparation of the confirmation. Pope Paul VI wrote with clarity: ‘It is the Holy Spirit who, today just as at the beginning of the Church, acts in every evangelizer who allows him/herself to be possessed and led by Him. The Holy Spirit places on his/her lips the words which he/she could not find by him/herself, and at the same time the Holy Spirit predisposes the soul of the hearer to be open and receptive to the Good News and to the kingdom being proclaimed.’ (Apostolic Exhortation, Evagelii Nuntiandi, 75).

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today, the languages of the whole world arise to God in a Pentecost of praise. In some American dioceses, the Mass is offered every Sunday in more than thirty different languages, including the silent praise of American Sign Language. Fifty years ago, the landscape of liturgy was very different. It was grounded firmly in Latin, which is to the present day still the official language of the Roman Rite. Very few people were fluent in Latin, even though in those days Latin was far more widely studied in school. Nevertheless, almost every Catholic was competent in the responses and chants of Latin since it is not difficult to pronounce. The clergy were normally minimally competent in Latin, since much of seminary education was conducted in that language.

When the Second Vatican Council was convened, all of the debate and daily work of the council was to be in Latin. In the first session in 1962, Boston's Cardinal Richard Cushing continually complained about it, and threatened not to return in 1963 if something wasn't done. He convinced the fathers when he rose to speak in fairly fluent Latin in an unforgettable Boston twang. The next year, he returned, but with a simultaneous translation system funded by the people of Boston. The ordinary everyday language of the people, the vernacular, had arrived at the Vatican via Boston!

Q. Is there a real presence when Protestants have Communion?



A. I know that most reject the idea of real presence, but does it matter whether they acknowledge it or not?

Yes, it does matter. There are 3 things that are required for the sacrament of the Eucharist to be valid:

1. proper matter and form
2. a validly ordained priest
3. the priest must have the proper intention

Many Protestant communities use grape juice instead of wine. That is invalid matter. They also don't always use the anything similar to the institution narrative.

Very few non-Catholic faith communities have valid lines of Apostolic Succession. However, presuming valid matter and form and a validly ordained priest, there still must be the intention to do what the Church intends. If there the community/church does not believe in the Real Presence there can be no proper intention.

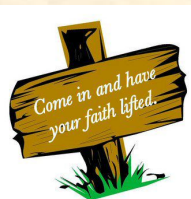
