Stewardship Bulletin Reflection

November 26, 2017 —

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ,
King of the Universe

EZ 34: 11-12, 15-17; PS 23: 1-3, 5-6; 1

COR 15: 20-26, 28; MT 25: 31-46

We celebrate today what is popularly and traditionally called the Feast of Christ the King. This is also the beginning of the last week of our Catholic Liturgical Year, as the New Year begins with Advent next Sunday. We often mention that time is a gift to us; this idea of measuring Church time is also a gift, but do we truly appreciate it?

People tend to say “I go to church.” In reality, Christ does not call us to “go” to church; He calls us to be Church. We should live our lives in such a way that it is clear we are Catholic and Christian and part of Christ’s Kingdom, for He is our King. Were you aware that the name “Christ” is a royal title in itself? In Greek it means “the anointed king.”

St. Paul referred to the Lord as “king of kings and lord of lords,” a phrase with which we are familiar. If we accept Christ as our King, and if we live our lives as His disciples and followers we are certainly part of His Kingdom. Pope Pius XI instituted today’s solemnity in 1925 at a time when many countries were struggling with total loyalty to secular royalty. Pius XI wanted Catholics to recognize that their loyalty was to a higher power, their spiritual king in heaven.

Pius XI wrote at that time, “For Jesus Christ reigns over the minds of individuals by His teachings, in their hearts by His love, in each one’s life by the living according to His law and the imitating of His example.”

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we have a modern feast, less than a century old, and placed at the very end of the liturgical cycle of Sundays only in 1969. In 1925, the world was in a sorry state from the vantage point of Pope Pius XI. The winds of war had swept the map of Europe raw, and ancient Christian dynasties had fallen in Russia and Spain. Although the Great War had ended, wars were breaking out everywhere. Fascism was already in control in Italy, and Nazism was on the horizon for Germany. The disorder making its claim on the human race was, the pope felt, an insult to the Divine Order. Pius XI designated the last Sunday in October as a day of universal recognition of the kingship of Christ. Creating this feast was an act of bravery by the pope, who was standing up against idolatry of the state and the dehumanizing forces of the modern world, things that are not hard to detect in today's world as well. In 1969 it seemed fitting to move the feast to a place of honor at the end of the year, a way of summing up the whole movement of the liturgical year toward the perfection of the Kingdom of God. In recent decades, many Protestant churches have adopted this day from the new Roman calendar, so it is shared now with the Church of England, the Episcopal, Presbyterian, and Lutheran churches, and others.

Q. *Can you explain the infallibility of the Pope?*

A We should think of the Holy Spirit as the source of the Pope's infallibility. When Christ ascended to heaven, the Holy Spirit was sent by Him to guide His Church. The Holy Spirit, of course, does not make mistakes or lead us astray.



It is not correct to say that, in the exercise of his infallibility, the Pope can "change" doctrine. As the chief executive officer in the Church, he can command changes in things like liturgy and governmental procedure. But he could never, for instance, change the teaching that there are three Persons in God, to a teaching that there are only two Persons in God. He defines what Church doctrine is, he does *not* invent it.

The last two infallible decrees were the declarations that Mary was conceived without sin (1854) and that she was assumed into heaven at her death and suffered no corruption of her body (1950). Both of these dogmas were universally held in the Church centuries before they were defined, and inquiries were made in every diocese to make sure they were.

The logical argument for papal infallibility is that Christ could not conceivably have founded a Church that would lead people into error, nor a Church that would have no means of being certain it was following Christ's doctrine. It has that means of certainty in an infallible leader, the Pope.

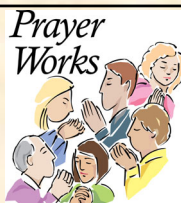
