

BISHOP BARBER ON THE SCANDALS IN THE CHURCH

Many Catholics have had their faith shaken by the recent revelations in Pennsylvania and the scandalous behavior of an American cardinal. There is no excuse for the priests who have committed crimes against innocent children. There is no excuse for bishops who have covered up these crimes. This is evil.

I endorse the call to establish an independent, lay-led review board that will address complaints against bishops. We need to find out the truth. Only the truth will set us free. And only the pope can authorize the steps that need to be taken to find the truth.

But there is action I can take as bishop of our diocese.

In Oakland, I am calling for an independent outside audit of our Diocesan Review Board policies, to ensure we are faithfully following the precepts of the Dallas Charter, the procedures to investigate sexual abuse by clergy. I also am going to review the membership of the current Diocesan Review Board to make sure it has the sufficient number of lay experts.

In addition to these actions, I am inviting all priests, religious and lay faithful of the diocese to join me in a Novena to St. Joseph, patron of the Universal Church, from September 6-14. On September 14th, the Feast of the Triumph of the Holy Cross, I call all of us in the diocese to a Day of Prayer, Penance and Reparation for the sins members of the Church have committed against innocent children.

I ask our priests to hold a Holy Hour with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in each parish at a convenient time, to pray in reparation, for healing for the victims, and for the cleansing and reform of the Church and her ministers.

I invite us all to do penance that day, especially my brother priests to fast and make other personal sacrifices in reparation for the pain suffered by the innocent.

On the Feast of the Holy Cross, we will stand with Mary at the foot of her son's cross, so that we can grow in the graces of compassion, justice, prevention, reparation — and strength to reform the Church.

A full version of Bishop's Letter can be found in the recent edition of "The Catholic Voice". Following Bishop's remarks, last Thursday we began saying special Prayer to St. Joseph at the end of each Mass. It will lead us to **Friday, September 14th when the Feast of the Triumph of the Holy Cross** is celebrated. On that day we will have two Masses: one at **9:00am and another at 7:30pm**. At the end of each Mass we will have an Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament when together we will ask our Lord to renew and strengthen His Church, with a spirit of purification and solidarity with those who are suffering. Please join us!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Back to work we go! Summer break is over and there is much to accomplish in school and in the workplace. It's a venerable Catholic custom to assign patron saints to the trades and occupations of life. This is largely in the realm of popular devotion, and although from time to time the Vatican declares a saint to be patron of this or that, the process is free-wheeling and just about uncontrollable. Still, there is a saint for almost any purpose, whether you are on death row (Dismas), having eye trouble (Lucy), or pursued by poisonous toads (Hubert). Medieval guilds would often associate themselves with heavenly patrons, so Saint Joseph has the carpenters, Thomas More the lawyers, and physicians get Saint Luke. If you're stuck in the airport, St. Joseph of Cupertino is on call since he was said to rise off the floor when he prayed, and if you're in a long line at the ATM, Saint Anthony Claret is for you.

In recent years, the Vatican has from time to time assigned a new patronage, as when Saint Aloysius Gonzaga was named the patron of HIV-AIDS patients, since as a young Jesuit novice he had cared for his fellow novices during a terrible plague. Anything that matters to us—nation, parish church, occupation, illness—can have a patron, and it is an aspect of Catholicism that has enormous appeal. To believe in the “communion of saints” is to know that the ties that bind us as a communion do not unravel with death, and that when we stand before life’s struggles, we do not stand alone. Who is your patron saint?



Impurity and scandal have wounded our Church and have brought much shame, sorrow and tears.


We ask you dearest St. Joseph, to be our guide along this very dark path, for you are the model of faith, purity and devotion that we need so desperately.
