
## GOD'S SUMMONS

Confronted with God's power and majesty, the first response of the prophet Isaiah was to acknowledge his sinfulness. "Woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips," he said aloud. Likewise, with his empty fishing nets dramatically filled at Jesus' instruction, Peter fell to his knees and cried out, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man."

Next, Peter got up. He docked his boats then left to follow Jesus. Isaiah also had a dramatic change of heart. When he heard the Lord say, "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" Isaiah answered, "Here I am, send me."

We are summoned daily by the Risen Lord. We are reminded of the saving power of the gospel and know in our heart of hearts that, as St. Paul wrote, believing in anything else won't lead to anything.

What will it take for you to move past your sinfulness? What will it take for you to get off your knees? What will it take for you to bring to dock what is unimportant and to accept your call to be God's messenger?

**Stewardship Bulletin Reflection  
February 10, 2019 -  
Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

**Is 6:1-2a, 3-8; Ps 138: 1-5, 7-8; 1 Cor 15:1-11;  
Lk 5:1-11**

Each of the readings for the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time makes reference to people being “called.” Of course, each of us is called by God to be a disciple. The challenge for us is to hear that call, understand it, and then to respond to it with action.

The first reading from Isaiah reminds us of a hymn based upon that reading most Catholics have sung and heard for the past few decades — *“Here I am Lord.”* The hymn portrays Isaiah’s response to God calling him. The lyrics in the refrain, known to many, are *“Here I am Lord. It is I lord. I have heard you calling in the night. I will go, Lord, where you lead me. I will hold your people in my heart.”*

The Gospel from Luke is a story known popularly — of how Jesus told Peter and James and John to go out in Peter’s boat and fish again, even though they had caught nothing previously. The catch was enormous and it was a changing point in the vocations of those men. They were fishermen, and had probably been fishermen since they were boys. Fishing was their vocation, but Jesus called them to something higher — to be *“fishers of men”*, and they responded by changing vocations from fishermen to apostles — messengers.

Some of us, like Isaiah, are called to vocations of discipleship which function parallel to our life’s vocation, our jobs. Others, like Peter, are called to lifetime vocations — holy orders. The point is not which vocation we follow — it is that as good stewards we recognize we have a vocation — a role — in building the Kingdom of God. Are we prepared and are we responding in the way we should? ***“Here I am Lord... I will go, Lord, where you lead me.”***

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Reign of God comes about because people commit to reversing their lives completely, to embracing new vision, new values. Many popular television shows exploit an unattractive side of human nature by pitting contestants against one another, even to the point of performing dangerous stunts or devious schemes, to gain money or favor.

At the liturgy, we counter that impulse by committing ourselves to live generously. In response to Christ's total gift, we offer bread and wine as the emblems of our lives, our hopes, our joys and sorrows. The bread and wine carried to the altar contain our lives, and by offering our lives to God, we prepare to receive the gift of God's own life. We are to become what we receive: the body of Christ.

On Sundays, this self-giving is often accompanied by a collection and procession of gifts for the poor and money for the upkeep of the parish. There are certainly other methods of collecting money, some perhaps more efficient. Yet the act of giving from our abundance, and attending to the needs of the poor, opens us up to participation in the changes the Reign of God requires.

**Q. I know that procuring abortion carries the penalty of automatic excommunication. Is this the unpardonable sin for which there is no forgiveness?**




**Catholic Answer** 0052qa is

**A.** It does not mean that. The sin that will not be forgiven was spoken of by our Lord in the Gospel of Matthew, chapter 12, verses 31 and 32. It is blasphemy against the Holy Spirit which is generally interpreted to mean that the person committing it has refused the grace of God through the moment of death, so that he is finally impenitent. The sin is unforgivable because the sinner refuses forgiveness.

The automatic excommunication of Canon 1398 can be removed by the bishop or through a priest who has been given faculties to absolve the sin, or in urgent cases even by the first priest to hear a sincere confession of the sin, if the penitent promises to come back to get the formal absolution of the bishop which the priest will ask for in the meantime. In this case the sinner is not refusing forgiveness but asking for it.

The Church makes the penalty for abortion automatic excommunication because the harm done cannot be humanly repaired. For that reason, in the case of deliberate abortion, the sin has a malice above and beyond that of most human failings. The child is denied Baptism, which in God's Providence is the ordinary way of getting to heaven. For anyone with normal human sensibilities and this Christian belief, the remorse is very nearly unbearable. But the sin can be forgiven because God's mercy is infinite.
