

DO NO HARM

We listen quite a while before we get to the “punch line” of the first reading today: even though it would be an easy thing to do, David will not harm the anointed one of the Lord. We, of course, know that Jesus is the Messiah, the anointed one of God, but the Bible uses this term for many different people. It is scripture’s way of indicating who has been chosen by God for a special place and mission in salvation history.

In today’s Gospel, Jesus presents a greatly enlarged list of those who, as children of God, we should not harm, but love instead: our enemies, those who curse us or do us harm, those who owe us money, the ungrateful, the wicked. The point of Jesus’ teaching is not to encourage these kinds of behaviors in others, but rather to form us in the image of our heavenly Father by increasing our opportunities to love unconditionally, expecting no return; to be merciful and forgiving, even when it would be easier not to.

PARISH FINANCIAL OFFICE REORGANIZED

After sudden passing of our former Bookkeeper, Richard Wogsland, a parish financial office has been completely reorganized. All the records have been updated and passed the financial audit conducted by ARMANINO, LLP firm last December. In order to keep our financial office services more efficient, variety of tasks related to payables processing, vendor maintenance, recording of collections, and document handling, which used to be performed exclusively by the bookkeeper, now are allocated between our new Bookkeeper, Rosemarie "Rose" Dimaano and the Administrative Assistant, Evelyn Bonito. Both positions are part-time effective February 1st, 2019. Even though many of us already know Evelyn and Rose, below you can find more details about their lives and professions.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Reign of God comes about because people commit to reversing their lives completely, to embracing new vision, new values. Many popular television shows exploit an unattractive side of human nature by pitting contestants against one another, even to the point of performing dangerous stunts or devious schemes, to gain money or favor.

At the liturgy, we counter that impulse by committing ourselves to live generously. In response to Christ's total gift, we offer bread and wine as the emblems of our lives, our hopes, our joys and sorrows. The bread and wine carried to the altar contain our lives, and by offering our lives to God, we prepare to receive the gift of God's own life. We are to become what we receive: the body of Christ.

On Sundays, this self-giving is often accompanied by a collection and procession of gifts for the poor and money for the upkeep of the parish. There are certainly other methods of collecting money, some perhaps more efficient. Yet the act of giving from our abundance, and attending to the needs of the poor, opens us up to participation in the changes the Reign of God requires.

Q. What if Eve had not disobeyed God in the Garden of Eden? What would then have been God's plan for Adam and Eve and their descendants on this earth?

Would there then have been any purpose in Jesus Christ coming to this planet?

A. If neither Adam nor Eve had sinned, the human race would have lived in a state of happiness until the end of the world. Since death is the penalty of original sin nobody would ever die. Speculation leads to the conclusion that God would finally take everybody to heaven, since He had raised humans to a supernatural level after their creation. Adam was the head of the human race, so if he had not sinned and only Eve had sinned, only the guilty Eve would have been punished. But if Eve had not sinned and, as a result of her fidelity, Adam also retained his innocence, there would have been no need for the Redeemer, Jesus Christ.

The prospect of a world without Christ is as appalling to the Church as the fact of Adam's sin. So in the prayers of the Easter Vigil she calls Adam's sin "happy fault" (*felix culpa*), as though it were a good thing that Adam sinned. The poet Edwin Muir expressed the same idea: 'What had Eden ever to say/Of hope and faith and pity and love? ... Strange blessings never in Paradise/Fall from these beclouded skies.' The Creator allowed Himself to be offended so that He could reveal Himself to His creatures in His Son, the Christ, in whose image and likeness the redeemable creatures were made.
