THE STORY OF OUR REDEMPTION

We begin the final week of Lent with these familiar readings. This year, we hear the Passion from the Gospel of Luke. These readings for Palm Sunday and the Passion used to be read on successive Sundays. Now they are combined into a single feast, so that we may see the whole sweep of the glory and the suffering played out.

Jesus accepts the adulation of the crowd, the foreshadowing of his glory in the Resurrection. He bids farewell to his disciples in his last Passover, and forgives his tormentors as he dies on the cross. Later this week, we enter the Holy Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, when the whole story of our redemption will play out once again.

HOLY TRIDUUM & EASTER

The Lenten Season is quickly coming to an end. The culmination of this season and of the entire liturgical year is the **Holy Triduum, the three-day celebration of the Passion of our Lord.**

We all come together to remember what Jesus Christ has done for us.

APRIL 18th – HOLY THURSDAY

On Holy Thursday we remember the Last Supper, and that Jesus gave himself for us in the Eucharist. We recall that He chose His apostles to serve, and to lead the Church. Remembering that Jesus washed their feet at the Last Supper, the priest will wash the feet of the chosen members of the congregation. Holy Thursday is also a very special day for all priests since it marks the beginning of their ordained priesthood. Instead of morning Mass, we will have **Morning Prayer at 9:00AM** followed by the Novena to Our Lady of Good Counsel. The main liturgy, **The Mass of the Lord's Supper,** with ceremony of *The Washing of the Feet* will begin **at 7:30PM.** The newly consecrated oils from the Cathedral will also be presented to our parish community.

APRIL 19th – GOOD FRIDAY

On Good Friday we remember the death of Jesus. According to the ancient custom, Mass is NOT celebrated on this day. Instead of morning Mass, we will have **Morning Prayer at 9:00AM** followed by the Novena to Our Lady of Good Counsel and to Divine Mercy. Our well attended **Stations of the Cross** will begin outside the church at **3:00pm.** Good Friday's main liturgy, **The Passion of the Lord,** will take place **at 7:30PM.** The three parts of the liturgy are: The *Liturgy of the Word*, the *Veneration of the Holy Cross*, and the *Holy Communion* with Hosts consecrated from the day before.

APRIL 20th – HOLY SATURDAY (Easter Vigil)

On Holy Saturday we will have Morning **Prayer at 9:00am** followed by the Novena to Our Lady of Good Counsel and to Divine Mercy. A solemn **Easter Vigil** will begin **at 7:30pm.** This liturgy consists of four parts: The *Service of Light*, the *Renewal of Baptismal Promises*, and the *Liturgy of the Eucharist.* During this liturgy one of the candidates will be baptized, two adults will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and 6 teen candidates from our CCD Program will receive their First Holy Communion.

We look at the Easter Triduum as one single celebration, lasting for few days. We are not supposed to separate the death of Jesus from His resurrection. Each of these days is of equal importance, so please join us as we celebrate together what Jesus has done for us.

APRIL 21st – EASTER SUNDAY

Holy Mass will be celebrated **at 8:30AM and 11:00am** (in English) followed by **12:30PM Mass** (in Polish).

APRIL 26th – FEAST OF OUR LADY OF GOOD COUNSEL

During this Mass married couple from our parish will renew their wedding vows. The celebration will end up with a pot-luck Dinner Dance in the parish hall.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Later this week, the Chrism Mass is celebrated in every cathedral in the world in preparation for the Easter Triduum. Only a bishop can consecrate chrism, pure olive oil infused with rich fragrance, so this liturgy is a sign of the unity of the local Church and the bishop's ministry to all who will be baptized and confirmed in our parishes in the coming year. Chrism is also used in the ordination of priests and bishops and the consecration of new altars. Two other sacramental oils, the unscented olive oil for catechumens and for the sick, will be blessed in the same liturgy and transported carefully to every parish by the beginning of the Triduum.

Remember when Noah's dove returned with the sign of the world's rebirth? The dove carried an olive branch, a pledge that God was breathing the world to life again. Yet olives require human nurture. Olives are inedible unless they are cured by human labor. Olive trees grow on sunny slopes, away from the shade of city walls, so they can only be properly tended, cured, and laboriously pressed in peace time. The Chrism Mass with its olive oils expresses God's deepest desires for us, and our resolve to place our lives in service to God's saving, healing, loving plan.



In celebrating the Feast day of Our Lady of Good Counsel on April 26, we invite everyone to join our novena to Our Lady from Thursday April 18 to April 26 after the 9AM masses.

Please let us know if you plan to attend by signing up using the book in the Church Vestibule.


