

## GOD'S ACTIONS NOW

When Jews celebrate the Passover, they always tell the story of the Exodus in present terms, as if they themselves experienced those events: when we were prisoners in Egypt; when God brought us out of slavery and through the waters of the sea. We would do well to follow their example and see the works of Jesus and his sacrifice as being in the present, as happening to us now. We believe that Christ's work, his teachings, and his sacrifice on the cross were not just for his followers in the past, but for all people at all times. When we think of this in our prayers, we become one in faith with that great cloud of witnesses, the saints.

We have been striving through Lent to repent of our sins and failings, and to follow Jesus more closely. Today in the story of the woman caught in adultery, we see Jesus forgiving the woman, saving her from a horrible death, and urging her not to sin any more. This is new, and brings out something for which the law had not allowed—forgiveness. Of course one can sin no more if one is dead, caught in one's sins forever. But Jesus introduces the concepts of forgiveness and reconciliation.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

These are the most commonly asked questions concerning the Bishop's Appeal:

### 1. What is the Bishop's Appeal?

The total budget for the Diocese of Oakland in 2019 is approximately \$17 million, and of that, the budget for diocesan-wide ministries and services is roughly \$7 million. While income is generated to support the budget through parish assessments, rent collection on property, service fees and interest on the diocesan investments, the income does not fully meet the budgetary needs for providing all diocesan level ministries, programs and services.

### 2. What does the Bishop's Appeal Fund?

The Bishop's Appeal is a direct appeal to the people of the Diocese, to ask them to make a pledge or a gift to supplement the ministry budget. Without the financial support of our diocesan family through the Bishop's Appeal, thousands throughout Alameda and Contra Costa counties, and beyond, could not be served. The Bishop's Appeal is an opportunity for each and every Catholic household to help further the mission of the Church. It is a chance for all parishes and missions of our Diocese to join together in support of the following vital ministries: Pastoral Ministries & Services, Religious Education & Formation, Clergy Formation, Support for Catholic Schools & Parishes in Need and Safe Environment Programs.

### 3. How was the Bishop's Appeal goal of \$3 million determined? How are parish goals determined?

There has been steady incremental growth in the success of the Bishop's Appeal over the last several years. Parish goals are determined by unrestricted parish revenue in a given year. (*Our parish goal for 2019 is the same as for the last year, \$9,800*)

### 4. What if my parish goes over goal? Where does the excess go?

100% of all funds collected over a parish's goal will be returned directly to parishes for their own special needs in the form of rebate checks paid at the conclusion of the Appeal (i.e. Feb 2019). The only exception to this rebate process will be for parishes with delinquent diocesan obligations (i.e. parish assessment, package insurance, workers' compensation, and health benefits.) These parishes will have funds collected over goal credited to these obligations.

### 5. Does my parish have to pay assessments on my Bishop's Appeal rebates?

Bishop's Appeal rebates are not assessed (taxed) by the Diocese.

### 6. What happens if my parish does not meet its established goal?

These goals are simply that – goals, not assessments, however, under the "Good Faith Effort" policy, if it is determined that parish leadership did not make an effort to succeed, the goal amount could be assessed to that parish. TBC...

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Next weekend, many churches provide palms to be carried in the opening moments of the liturgy, as we gratefully recall Jesus' entry into the holy city of Jerusalem. The children who greeted him on that day used what was both handy and traditional, since palms were carried to inaugurate the joyful harvest feast of Succoth. To this day, faithful Jews are directed to take a beautiful palm branch, green and straight as possible, called a *lulav*, and bind it with three myrtle branches fifteen inches long, and two longer willow branches. At the end of the temple service, everyone carries the *lulav*, circling the sanctuary in a dance called the *Hoshanot*, singing hymns of joy.

In other climates, Jews and Christians alike have had to make accommodations over the years. In Italy, everyone carries olive branches today, often brought from their own garden. In England, forsythia branches are preferred, a relative of the olive, sign of peace. Germans prefer pussywillows, and others look for flowering spring branches. In our part of the world, what do you think would be the best choice to express joy and welcome, and to remind us of the joy of Christ's victory even as we prepare to commemorate his passion?

Please let us know if you plan to attend by signing up using the book in the Church Vestibule.


