THIS IS THE HOLY TRINITY

Today we celebrate the Holy Trinity, one of the most confounding mysteries of our faith. Through this mystery we experience our relationship to God: Creator, Savior, and Holy Spirit. This relationship is not easy to understand or to describe. It does not become clearer through analysis. Its complexity mirrors the complexity of all our relationships. We understand our relationships with our spouses, our children, our parents, and our friends only through daily give-and-take, annual rituals, and the life-changing moments we share. We understand our relationships only as we live them. The relationships we have with those we love, and who love us, sustain us through an uncertain and difficult life. This is the Holy Trinity.

What is striking about today's readings is that each is incomplete. What they do offer is a description of a moment in our relationship, a memory of a time and an event when our relationship made sense even though that sense may be beyond our ability to describe fully. Often that is all that our faith offers, that is, a memory of what is possible, what is promised, what has been given. A memory of eternity, of love beyond understanding is to be cherished and nurtured even if not fully understood. This is the Holy Trinity.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today's feast, extending a dimension of Easter joy into Ordinary Time, reminds us that every aspect of worship centers on the mystery of God in three persons. At baptism, we are initiated into Christ *and* the Spirit. The Creed we recite at Mass every Sunday has its roots in the ancient celebration of baptism, when a new believer was questioned at the edge of the waters of the font with three questions: Do you believe in God, the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit? Three questions, three affirmations, three immersions into the saving waters. Because every liturgy abounds with references to the Trinity, not only in words but in blessings by the sign of the cross, this feast was not easily accepted into the calendar. Pope Alexander in the eleventh century remarked that the liturgy is so laden with praise of the Trinity that there was no need for a special feast. Two hundred years later, while in exile in France, Pope John XXII proclaimed the feast, but it was not until 1911 that Pope St. Pius X gave it status as a solemnity.

A favorite image in art for today is the Icon of the Trinity, showing three glorious winged men seated at a table laden with bread and a cup of wine. It recalls Abraham's hospitality to angels and gives expression to the inner life of God, a life lived in relationship, a life poured out in abundance whenever Christians gather at the table of the Eucharist to give praise to the Father, in Christ, in the embrace of the Spirit.

Q. What would you say to the argument that Christ meant the Eucharist to be only a symbol of His Body and Blood and that in any event He said only "DO this in memory of Me" without restricting His command to priests?



Catholic Answer 0052qa

A. The Catholic doctrine of the reality of the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist does not depend only on what He said at the Last Supper but also on what He said in His promise of the Eucharist in the sixth chapter of St. John's Gospel. He drove away many of His followers who said His saying was hard to believe. He could easily have recalled them by saying that His "flesh to eat" and His "blood to drink" were only symbolic statements, but He did not. He let them go away when they would not accept His statements literally. As for the priesthood being necessary to confect the Eucharist, Christ spoke the words of commission, "Do this in memory of Me," only to a carefully selected, very small group of His followers called His Apostles. He did not tell the crowds that followed Him to have picnic suppers in His memory. But points like this are only school-debate arguments.


To understand the Eucharist and the Real Presence you really should know something about the history of religion, the place of sacrifice in it, and why other sacrifices are worthless in comparison with the Body and Blood of the God -Man. This will lead you into the doctrine of the Trinity which in turn will demonstrate , the need and logic of many other doctrines. The Catholic faith is like a pattern on a Persian rug or on a tapestry. Once you see how a doctrine fits into a pattern you can see its necessity. If you just cut off a corner of the tapestry and look only at it, you won't see much of anything.
