JESUS can give YOU PEACE


Stewardship Bulletin Reflection **May 26, 2019 - Sixth Sunday of Easter** *Catholic Stewardship Consultants, Inc.*

ACTS 15:1-2, 22-29; PS 67: 2-3, 5, 6, 8; REV 21:10-14, 22-23; JN 14:23-29

Our Gospel Reading from John 14 recounts what Jesus says to His disciples as He prepares to leave them. Specifically the Lord says, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." You may be aware that in Jesus' time (as well as in many parts of the world today) the common greeting was *Shalom*. That means, of course, "peace." It is nonetheless not only a greeting but it is also what people said when they parted.

Jesus makes a point of making it clear to His followers and to us that He is not just saying "Peace" the way people usually do, but from Him it is filled with more strength and meaning. It is "Not as the world gives" that Jesus is saying "Peace be with you." Jesus is telling us that He through the Holy Spirit will always be with us, stand next to us, and strengthen us. That is something we must believe. Trusting in the Lord is a key aspect of stewardship.

In our world we are more likely to say "Good-bye" than "Shalom." However, even that has a meaning with a much deeper message. "Good-bye" derives from the farewell "God be with you" or "God be with ye." Thus, when we say "good-bye" we are also giving someone the same message that Jesus gives us. God is with us — always. He loves you.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Why is it still Easter? The lilies have long since faded. The roots of our tradition of fifty days of rejoicing from Easter to Pentecost lie in the seven-day rhythm of the Jewish week, drawn from the six days of creation plus a Sabbath day. A favorite name for the Lord's Day among our ancestors in the faith was "The Eighth Day," meaning that in Christ a breakthrough to a new humanity was achieved. With that inner architecture, it makes sense to see Pentecost as a week of weeks, forty-nine days plus one, again signaling that a new age has begun in Christ and the outpouring of his Spirit. The Jewish appreciation for Pentecost gave rise to the Jubilee year, the fiftieth year, when debts were released and prisoners set free. Today, the character of our Easter Sundays is conveyed by joyful Alleluias and the rite of sprinkling at Mass. Long ago, people expressed this joy by suspending all rules of fasting and by never kneeling at liturgy.

These customs all point to our conviction that time is holy. There is an elegant balance to the Christian year: forty days of Lenten fast and discipline give way to fifty days of unrestrained rejoicing. That's why it is still Easter!

Q. I know that procuring abortion carries the penalty of automatic excommunication. Is this the unpardonable sin for which there is no forgiveness ?

A It does not mean that. The sin that will not be forgiven was spoken of by our Lord in the Gospel of Matthew, chapter 12, verses 31 and 32. It is blasphemy against the Holy Spirit which is generally interpreted to mean that the person committing it has refused the grace of God through the moment of death, so that he is finally impenitent. The sin is unforgivable because the sinner refuses forgiveness.

The automatic excommunication of Canon 1398 can be removed by the bishop or through a priest who has been given faculties to absolve the sin, or in urgent cases even by the first priest to hear a sincere confession of the sin, if the penitent promises to come back to get the formal absolution of the bishop which the priest will ask for in the meantime. In this case the sinner is not refusing forgiveness but asking for it.

The Church makes the penalty for abortion automatic excommunication because the harm done cannot be humanly repaired. For that reason, in the case of deliberate abortion, the sin has a malice above and beyond that of most human failings. The child is denied Baptism, which in God's Providence is the ordinary way of getting to heaven. For anyone with normal human sensibilities and this Christian belief, the remorse is very nearly unbearable. But the sin can be forgiven because God's mercy is infinite.
