

There's a lot of traveling, delivering, and visiting going on in our readings today. In Genesis Abraham cares for the needs of three mysterious travelers. The psalm responds, celebrating the kind of righteousness that Abraham practices. Then, in his letter to the Colossians, Saint Paul describes his own ministry as almost

like a delivery service: he, God's steward, brings the word of God to their community. Finally, Luke's Gospel shares the well-known story of Mary and Martha, and the different ways they welcome Jesus into their home. Amid all this coming and going, we are invited to pay attention to the ways we tend to the needs of others. Each of us can ask, *How am I present to God and others in my life?*



July 21, 2019 -
Sixteenth Sunday
in Ordinary Time

**GN 18: 1-10A; PS15:2-5;
COL 1:24-28; LK 10:38-42**

In today's Gospel reading from St. Luke, we receive a reminder about the proper use of the gift of time, a fundamental aspect of a stewardship way of life. Our passage highlights one of the most famous dinner parties ever known, recalling the day that Martha and Mary hosted our Lord in their home. We are told that Martha, as a good steward, welcomes Christ in but then becomes "*burdened with much serving*" while her sister and fellow hostess chooses to simply sit with Jesus, listening to Him speak.

Martha becomes indignant at Mary's behavior and complains to Jesus, "*Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me.*" But Jesus, in His infinite wisdom, refuses to get pulled into this sisterly spat. Instead, He offers Martha a fresh way to look at the situation. "*Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing.*"

What is that one thing? It is to put Jesus first in our lives and above all other things; to "*sit at his feet*" and listen as Mary did, giving Him the first priority of our time no matter how busy we think we are. When we truly commit to putting Christ first in our daily lives through a regular time of prayer and frequent participation in the sacraments, we will find that all our other concerns become less pressing, less overwhelming.

Why is this so? Because the time we invest in our relationship with God saturates all aspects of our lives with His grace and because God cannot be outdone in generosity. He will abundantly reward any sacrifice we make in order to spend time with Him.

Q.I find the view that Mormons cannot be considered Christians offensive since I am a convert from Mormonism and my parents are devout Mormons. They ensured that I received a thoroughly Christian training as a child. What do you say?



A . I could agree with you, but only after adopting your meaning for the word *Christian*, which I won't do. "Christian" to many people has come to mean only "good" and "moral," indicating that goodness which is natural to human beings and which does not derive from theological beliefs. This usage was made famous by the United Nations diplomat who asked the Muslims and the Jews why on earth they could not settle their differences in a Christian spirit. They could, of course, if "Christian" meant only "kindly, sincere, honest, loving, good, moral" and so on. It's all a question of semantics. On that level, I would argue that "Christian" should be reserved for those who accept not only the moral teachings of Christ, but also the stunning revelations that He was the Son of God, equal to God the Father who came to give men and women a specific means (the Church) of attaining a blessed and eternal union in God.

The name "Christian" was first given to Christ's followers in Antioch not because of their moral goodness but because they *believed in what Christ revealed*. Those who did not believe all that Christ revealed were not called Christians.

So, saying that Jews, Muslims, or Mormons are not Christian does not imply that the members of these religions cannot be as morally good as Christians. On their own principles, they should reject being called Christians, just as I would reject being called Muslim, even though the good Muslim who called me that meant it as a compliment.
