
CHOICE

THE 2020 BISHOP'S APPEAL EDUCATION WEEKEND

For most of us, our experience of Church is the parish we belong

to. The Church is, however, much more than that. We are all called in mission to serve the Church and its people outside our parish boundaries, those who live in our Diocese and those who belong to the Universal Church.

When it comes to Oakland Diocese, there are many exciting and positive things happening through the ministries and services our Diocese provides. Thanks to the annual Bishop's Appeal, the following ministries and programs can be continued:

1. Religious Education and Faith Formation

Last year, more than 600 candidates participated in RCIA formation; 750 Catholic School faculties participated in Catechetical Conference and 31 SPRED centers provided help to those with disabilities.

2. Clergy Formation & Support

From initial formation in the seminary into retirement, the Diocese provides support for our priests. Additionally, the gifts to the Bishop's Appeal support the retreats and ongoing formation seminars for the priests and deacons.

3. Pastoral Ministries & Services

Because of different ministries & services (CYO, Raquel Vineyard for healing, Virtus Safe Environment, etc.), the faith of families and individuals across the Diocese can be promoted and strengthened.

4. Support for Catholic Schools & Parishes in Need

Thanks to the Bishop's Appeal, struggling inner-city schools and parishes are able to provide an education and spiritual formation to young generation.

5. Priest Retirement & Care

Our donations to the Bishop's Appeal help retired priests to deal with their daily needs, especially when their health is declining and they require special care.

In his message, Bishop Barber says: *"Each year I come to you and ask for your support so I can maintain the health and vibrancy of our Catholic community. Would you help me once again?"*

THE CHAIR OF ST. PETER THE APOSTLE

February 22

In brushing up for "Catholic Jeopardy," it might help to know that there is only one feast on the calendar for a thing, rather than a person or mystery. It's for a chair: Saint Peter's chair in fact

After the Resurrection, there can be no doubt that the disciples reserved a special place for Simon Peter in the upper room. Later, Peter became the bishop of Antioch in today's Syria, the place where we were first called Christians. From there, he went to Rome, the center of the Empire, where it is said that Peter sat in a chair in the house of Priscilla and Aquila to instruct his flock. Jesus, in entrusting the keys of the Kingdom to Peter and his successors, entrusted his compassion and mercy to them, and charged them with pointing to the Kingdom of God. Compassion and mercy are to resonate through their teaching.

Since the ancient sign of a teacher is the chair ("disciple" literally means one who sits at the feet of a teacher), Peter's chair has long been treasured. Today there is a symbolic shrine of Peter's chair above the main altar of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. This monument is the last work of Bernini, a huge bronze throne supported by four doctors of the Church: Augustine and Ambrose from the Western Church, and Chrysostom and Athanasius from the East. High above it is the alabaster window of the descent of the Holy Spirit




