**FR. JAN
PASTOR
OF OLG PARISH**

In his letter sent to Fr. Jan on February 17th, 2017 Bishop Michael Barber wrote:

“Dear Father Jan, you have served Our Lady of Good Counsel well as Parochial Administrator since 2011. Having completed a successful review of your ministry, the Priest Personnel Board has recommended to me that you be now installed as Pastor of the community that you have been serving. Therefore, by this letter and in accord with the norms of Canon Law, I appoint you Pastor of Our Lady of Good Counsel Parish in San Leandro and its people, and confer upon you the rights and responsibilities pertaining to this office. This assignment is effective March 1, 2017. In accord with Canon 522 and the September 24, 1984 ruling of the USCCB, the term of office for this appointment is for six (6) years.”

The Bishop appoints the pastor as "the proper shepherd" of the parish. (*The word pastor in Latin means "shepherd."*) The pastor, mindful that he is to exercise his authority as an extension of the Bishop and in the example of Christ, the Good Shepherd, must care for the souls of the faithful entrusted to him. He must fulfill his duties to teach, to sanctify and to govern the faithful with the cooperation of the priests, deacons, religious and lay members of his parish. He must be a priest "distinguished for his sound doctrine and integrity of morals, and endowed with a zeal for souls and other virtues" (No. 521.2).

The role of Pastor may be summed up in the following:

- *Spiritual Leader* - one who promotes spiritual growth among members of the community and models his personal holiness

- *Shepherd* - sensitive to the community needs, responds to those needs and is involved in the life of the community

- *Leader of Community* - develops a vision and sense of mission for the parish and gathers the people together

- *Staff Developer* - recruits and supervises staff; evaluates and supports staff members and volunteers in their ministry, giving direction and continuity to parish programs

- *Administrator* - oversees the stewardship of the fiscal and physical plant resources of the parish

- *Teacher* - an instructor in theology, Scripture, and Church teaching

While pondering these terms and "job descriptions," the faithful should pray for their parish priests each day that they may be good priests who reflect in their lives, Jesus, the true, eternal Priest.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The origins of the custom of burning a lamp before the tabernacle are in Jewish worship, where a lamp called *ner tamid* or "eternal flame" burns before the ark in every synagogue. The ark contains the sacred scrolls of the Torah. The flame represents the menorah in the Temple, and therefore is never extinguished. In fact, the word "tabernacle" itself is derived from Hebrew, as *taber* is the Hebrew word for "tent," and harkens back to the forty years of wandering in the desert. The pilgrim people were sustained in hope by an awareness that God was not only in the pillar of cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night, but had quite literally "pitched his tent with them" in the shelter for the Ark of the Covenant. Some artisans have used this theme of "ark" or "tent" to design a tabernacle for the Blessed Sacrament.

In Christian practice, Anglicans and Catholics use a sanctuary lamp to point toward the presence of the reserved sacrament, and Lutherans use it as a sign of God's presence in the house of worship, but not necessarily as a clue that the Eucharist is reserved. Why, even in an age of electric light, is the sanctuary lamp an oil light or candle? Perhaps not only to point to Christ, the light of the world, but also to point to sacrifice. For the light to exist, there must be sacrifice. The oil or wax is transformed into light, just as those who pray here, or who will receive viaticum from here, are called to transformation in Christ.

Q. What is the origin of the word God?

A. The word "el" is an ancient semitic word meaning "god". Any deity would be referred to as El. When ancient Hebrews refer to THE God, they would couple "el" with a descriptor, ie. "El Elyon" (My God Most High), "El Shaddai" (My God Almighty), and "El Olam" (My God Everlasting).





That may be the reason why Moses asked God for His name before returning to Egypt: to differentiate the God of Israel from other ancient semitic deities by providing the name by which God called himself. The name I AM was spoken in ancient Hebrew phonetically with a sound similar to "Hyeh Hweh" It was sort of an onomatopoeia, without a proper spelling, so in early translations it was rendered as "YHWH" which progressed over time to "Jehovah".
