DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

(Indulgences)

The Feast of Divine Mercy celebrated this weekend was revealed by Christ to Saint Faustina last century.

This feast had been extended to the entire Catholic Church by Pope St. John Paul II.

Speaking to this humble nun, Jesus revealed to her a great desire to show mercy to all humanity, a mercy especially tied to the traditional hour of His death, the three o'clock hour. The blue and red rays of light emanating from the side of Christ represent His mercy shown in the blood and water of Eucharist and baptism. The focus is always on the merciful love of God shown to repentant sinners.

Those who observe Divine Mercy Sunday may obtain a plenary indulgence, a "full" remission of the punishment and suffering due to forgiven sin in the afterlife. The Greek word "plene" means full. Venial and mortal sins can be forgiven on this side of heaven and the person can be saved, but there is an experience of justice for these sins on the other side of life that can be quite painful for the soul when entering eternal life. We call this "purgatory." It is not so much a place as a process.

Pope Benedict XVI once said: "*Purgatory is like a purifying fire burning inside a person, a painful experience of regret for one's sins. A soul stained by sin cannot present itself to God. The soul that is aware of the immense love and perfect justice of God consequently suffers for not having responded correctly and perfectly to that love.*" The experience of purgatory comes to an end as the soul enters full communion with God.

The indulgence is granted under the usual conditions:

1. Sacramental confession done near the Divine Mercy Sunday if needed be
2. Holy Communion - preferably on the day, or the days before or after
3. Prayer for the Pope ("Creed", "Our Father", "Hail Mary", "Glory be...", and a devout prayer to the merciful Lord – e.g. "Jesus, I trust in you!")

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

An ancient title for this Sunday is *Dominica in Albis*, or "Sunday in White." During the Easter Vigil, the newly baptized are invested with a white garment, a sign that they have put on Christ. At one time, the garments were worn for a full week of celebration and reflection, and on this Sunday the newly baptized would appear in their robes again in their new place among the faithful for Eucharist.

In later centuries, the energy of new life at Easter was largely forgotten, and this Sunday was renamed "Quasimodo Sunday," or "Low Sunday." In recent years, with the recovery of the insight that Easter is the privileged time for celebrating and renewing baptism, there is nothing "Low" about this Sunday. At a week's distance, the beauty and grace of our Easter celebration is sustained by joyful alleluias, the blessing and sprinkling of holy water, and the comfort of the Lord's presence to us. He is risen, and he summons us together, opening up the scriptures for us, breaking the bread, filling us with new life.



Q. What is the biblical reason Catholics pray to dead saints for intercession?

A. No one prays to *dead* saints, because those in heaven are more alive than we are. The Lord is God of the living, not of the dead. The fervent prayer of a righteous man is very powerful (Jas 5:16). Those in heaven are surely righteous, since nothing unclean can enter heaven (Rv 21:27). Those in heaven are part of the Mystical Body of Christ and have not been separated from us by death, but surround us as a great cloud of witnesses (Heb 12:1). They stand before the throne of God and offer our prayers to him (Rv 5:8) and cheer us on as we run the good race. Intercession among members of the body of Christ is pleasing to God (1 Tm 2:1-4) and even commanded by him (Jn 15:17). Those in heaven have a perfected love, so how could they *not* intercede for us? Christ is the vine, and we are the branches; if we are connected to him, we are inseparably bound together as well. Can the eye say to the hand, "I need you not"? Neither are we to say we don't need the prayers of our brothers and sisters (alive here or in heaven), because salvation is a family affair.


