

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The reign of God comes about because people commit to reversing their lives completely, to embracing new vision, new values. Many popular television shows exploit an unattractive side of human nature by pitting contestants against one another, even to the point of performing dangerous stunts or devious schemes, to gain money or favor.

At the liturgy, we counter that impulse by committing ourselves to live generously. In response to Christ's total gift, we offer bread and wine as the emblems of our lives, our hopes, our joys and sorrows. The bread and wine carried to the altar contain our lives, and by offering our lives to God, we prepare to receive the gift of God's own life. We are to become what we receive: the body of Christ.

On Sundays, this self-giving is often accompanied by a collection and procession of gifts for the poor and money for the upkeep of the parish. There are certainly other methods of collecting money, some perhaps more efficient. Yet the acts of giving from our abundance and attending to the needs of the poor open us up to participation in the changes the Reign of God requires.

**Q** "Belief in an invisible God makes about as much sense as believing in Santa Claus. How can you believe in a God you can't see?"




**Catholic Answer** 0063

A. Most people don't believe in Santa Claus, and it's not because they haven't seen him. They don't believe in him because the evidence shows that he doesn't exist. But this is not the case with God.

The fact that we cannot see God is no proof against His existence. Think about it: There are many things we know exist that we can't see. Have you ever seen a molecule or electricity or an idea or an emotion (e.g., love or happiness)? But we know that they exist nonetheless. Although we can't see these things, we don't doubt their existence because we experience them all the time. We can't see the wind, but we know it exists because we see its effects in the world: We feel it on our faces and we see trees and objects sway. It is similar with God—we know He exists by His effects on the world and in our lives. Jesus knew we would ask such questions when He said, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe" (In 20:29).

Yet, in a very profound way, we can see God in the person and life of Jesus, the God-man, the Second Person of the Trinity. As St. Paul puts it, Jesus is "the image of the invisible God" (Col 1:15). Jesus assures us that "he who has seen me has seen the Father" (In 14: 9), Upon His ascension into heaven, Jesus promised that He would remain with us forever through the Church (see Mt 28:20).

Through faith, Christ is made visible to us within His Church: "The Church is the Body of Christ. Through the Spirit and his action in the sacraments, above all the Eucharist, Christ, who once was dead and is now risen, establishes the community of believers as his own Body"
