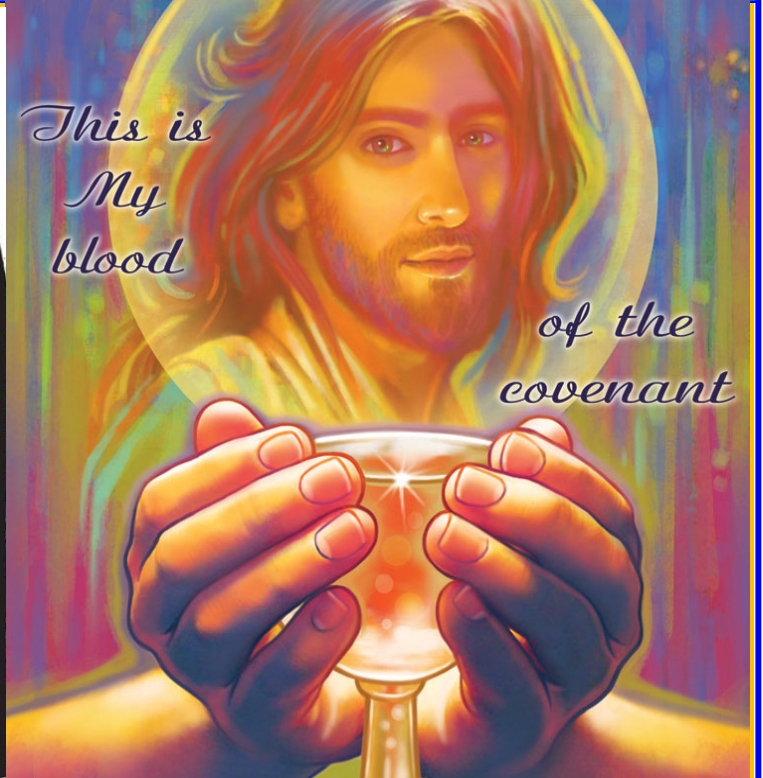
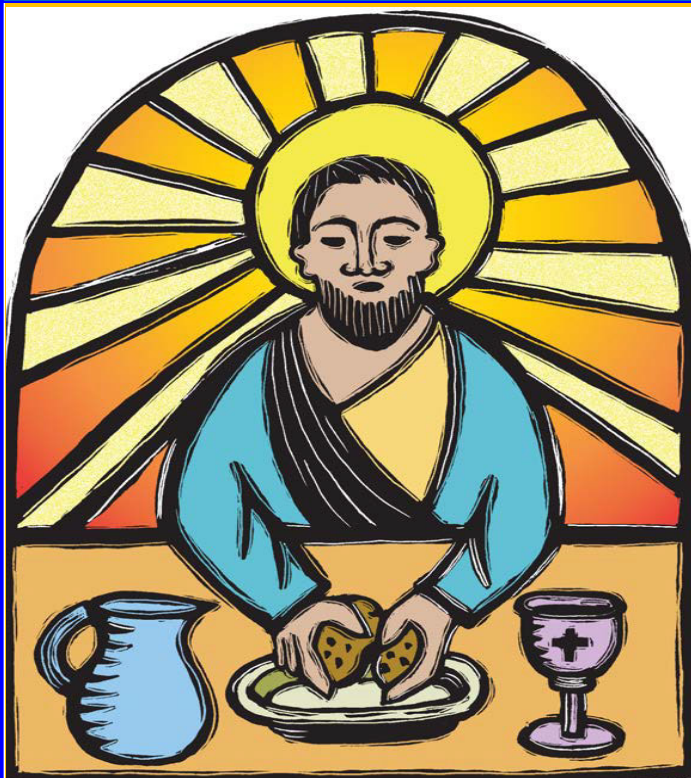

Q & A ABOUT CONFIRMATION

What is the Sacrament of Confirmation?

Confirmation is the Sacrament which completes the grace of Baptism by a special outpouring of gifts by the Holy Spirit which seal or "confirm" the baptized in union with Christ and equips them for active participation in worship and apostolic life of the Church (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*)

When was the Sacrament of Confirmation instituted by Jesus?

The Sacrament of Confirmation was instituted by Our Lord Jesus Christ when he conferred the Holy Spirit upon His Apostles on Easter Sunday (*John 20:22-23*) and on Pentecost Sunday (*Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11*).

What are the effects of the Sacrament of Confirmation?

Through the Sacrament of Confirmation, the very same Jesus, who bestowed the Holy Spirit upon His Apostles, brings about through the ritual celebration of this Sacrament these effects:

The graces we received in Baptism are increased and deepened. We are more firmly united to Christ. Our adoption as children of God is intensified.

Confirmation increases the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit in us: Wisdom, Understanding Counsel, Knowledge, Fortitude, Piety, and Fear of the Lord.

Confirmation perfects our bond with the Church.

The Lord gives us the strength of the Holy Spirit to witness to, spread, defend, and even to die for our Faith.

After increasing the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit in us, Confirmation allows those who respond to those Gifts to manifest the presence of the Holy Spirit through the twelve Fruits of the Holy Spirit: charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness (benignity), goodness, generosity, gentleness, fidelity (faithfulness), modesty, continence (self-control), and chastity.

Confirmation imprints an indelible character on the soul of the recipient. Confirmation may be received only once and may never be repeated.

Next Saturday, June 9th seven candidates from our parish will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the Cathedral of Christ the Light in Oakland. Please keep them and their families in your prayers.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The origins of today's solemnity lie in thirteenth-century Belgium. In those days, people seldom received Holy Communion, and never from the chalice. A nun in a troubled convent, Juliana of Liège, devoted her life to stirring up love for the Eucharist, lobbying for a feast day to honor the Blessed Sacrament with Masses and processions.

Juliana may have been inspired by the Ascension Day processions in nearby Bruges. Crusaders brought a treasure home to Bruges from Constantinople in 1204: a reliquary said to contain a cloth from Joseph of Arimathea with which he had helped prepare the body of Jesus for burial. The stain on the cloth was said to be the holy blood itself, and so the people of Bruges built a great basilica to house the relic. Bruges became a great center of pilgrimage because of this treasure, and the procession of the Holy Blood is still one of the greatest festivals in Belgium today. The bishop carries the relic through the narrow streets, and the people wear medieval costumes and act out scenes from the Bible.

Q "If God knows everything, then He knows whether we're going to end up in heaven or hell. Doesn't this take away our free will, since we can't change what God already knows will happen?"

A. Just because God knows where we will end up heaven or hell-this does not mean He *causes* us to go to either place. Remember: God is eternal; He is not restricted by time like we are. For God, there is no such thing as past, present, or future, but only "now." This is difficult to understand, so here's an analogy that might help. Think of a man sitting on top of a tall building looking down upon a city. From his vantage point he is able to witness events as they occur. At one point, he notices two cars speeding, about to collide at an intersection. Neither of the drivers is aware of the other car because they can't see each other. Does the knowledge of man on the building in any way restrict the freedom of the two drivers? Of course not. Both drivers could choose to slow down immediately and obey the rules of the road.

Although God's presence in our lives is much different from the way a man watches the world from a building, the analogy does help us understand that even though God knows the outcome of all things, He will never remove our free will in our choosing to either love Him or reject Him. In fact, without that freedom, you and I would never have the ability to choose to follow Christ in order to attain heaven. "Men, as intelligent and free creatures, have to journey toward their ultimate destinies by their free choice and preferential love" (CCC 311).

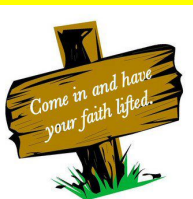
