

## HOLY TRIDUUM & EASTER SUNDAY

The Lenten Season is quickly coming to an end. The culmination of this season and of the entire liturgical year is the **Holy Triduum, the three-day celebration of the Passion of our Lord.** We all come together to remember what Jesus Christ has done for us.

### MARCH 29<sup>th</sup> – HOLY THURSDAY

On Holy Thursday we remember the Last Supper, and that Jesus gave himself for us in the Eucharist. We recall that He chose His apostles to serve, and to lead the Church. Remembering that Jesus washed their feet at the Last Supper, the priest will wash the feet of the chosen members of the congregation. Holy Thursday is also a very special day for all priests since it marks the beginning of their ordained priesthood. Instead of morning Mass, we will have **Morning Prayer at 9:00AM.** The main liturgy, **The Mass of the Lord's Supper,** with ceremony of *The Washing of the Feet* will begin at **7:30PM.** The newly consecrated oils from the Cathedral will also be presented to our parish community.

### MARCH 30<sup>th</sup> – GOOD FRIDAY

On Good Friday we remember the death of Jesus. According to the ancient custom, Mass is NOT celebrated on this day. Instead of morning Mass, we will have **Morning Prayer at 9:00AM.** Our well attended **Stations of the Cross** will begin outside the church at **3:00pm.** Good Friday's main liturgy, **The Passion of the Lord,** will take place at **7:30PM.** The three parts of the liturgy are: The *Liturgy of the Word*, the *Veneration of the Holy Cross*, and the *Holy Communion* with Hosts consecrated from the day before.

### APRIL 31<sup>st</sup> – HOLY SATURDAY (Easter Vigil)

On Holy Saturday we will have Morning **Prayer at 9:00am.** **The Blessing of the Easter Basket Foods** will be at 10:00AM, 11:00AM and 12:00Noon in the parish hall. A solemn **Easter Vigil** will begin at **7:30pm.** This liturgy consists of four parts: The *Service of Light*, the *Renewal of Baptismal Promises*, and the *Liturgy of the Eucharist.* During this liturgy one of the candidates will be baptized and together with other two will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

### APRIL 1<sup>st</sup> – EASTER SUNDAY

**Holy Mass** will be celebrated at **8:30AM and 11:00am** (in English) followed by **12:30PM Mass** (in Polish).

We look at the Easter Triduum as one single celebration, lasting for few days. We are not supposed to separate the death of Jesus from His resurrection. Each of these days is of equal importance, so please join us as we celebrate together what Jesus has done for us.

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

For many centuries, Christian pilgrims have longed to walk in the footsteps of Jesus, and on Passion Sunday the eyes of the world are on the *Via Dolorosa*, the "Road of Sorrows," in Jerusalem. As soon as it became safe for Christians to worship in public in the fourth century, a way was marked out. It was changed a few times over the years, and today's usual route was sketched by the Franciscans six hundred years ago, although Anglicans and Byzantines have their own unique detours. Friday is the most favored day, although it is crowded then. Almost everyone begins at the Lion's Gate in the Muslim Quarter, and ends at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. It's less than a quarter mile, but it threads its way through crowded markets with souvenir shops and fast-food snacks. There are, just as in your parish church, fourteen stations along the way. The exact spots are not known, but what matters is the pilgrim's unique ability to see even an ordinary road in a teeming city as something more than meets the eye.





**Q.** What should I be doing to keep the Sabbath holy?

**A.** Follow Canon 1247 of the new Code, which says that the faithful on Sundays and holy days of obligation are bound to participate in the Mass and abstain from those labors and business concerns which impede the worship to be rendered to God, impede the joy which is proper to the Lord's Day, or impede the proper relaxation of mind and body on that day. This is a considerable mitigation of Exodus 31:15, but of course Christians-as St. Paul so often insisted- are not bound by the Law of Moses. It is also a mitigation of what was the general understanding that no servile work is allowable on Sunday. The new Code doesn't distinguish between servile and non-servile work but between 1. work that would allow one to go to Mass, enjoy the Lord's Day, and use it for recreation; and 2. work which would prevent any of these things. For example, it is commendable not to shop on Sunday (in the spirit of not eating meat on Friday), but it is permissible to shop as long as it does not interfere with Mass attendance and doesn't make Sunday "just another day." Going out to eat would really be part of what the new Code encourages, a celebration and enjoyment of the Sunday. Employers of cooks and waiters and bus boys have the obligation of seeing that those under them are able to go to Mass. They can hold them to work regular hours if there is real economic necessity. The Church recognized that, even on the days when it forbade "servile" work on Sunday.
