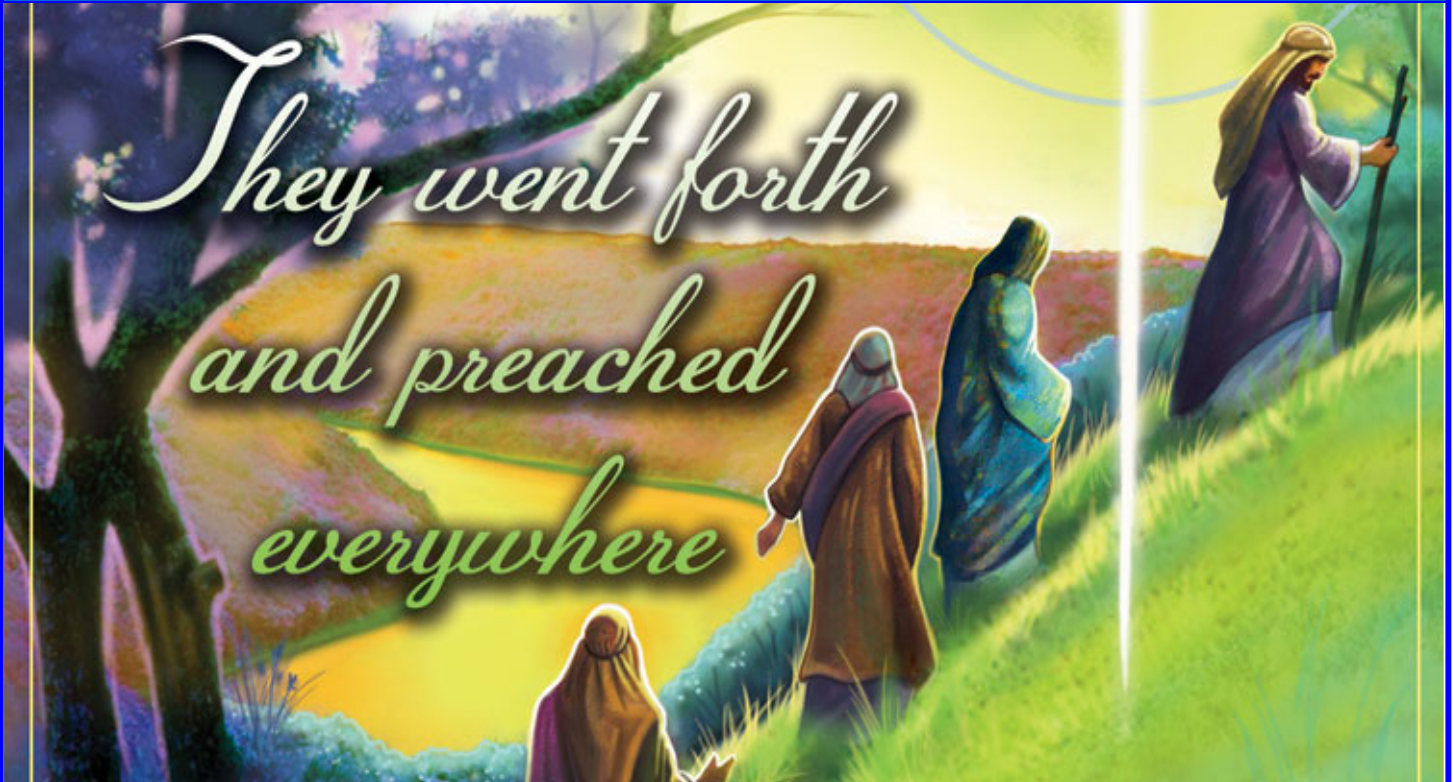

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In Ireland and the United Kingdom, Mother's Day is over. "Mothering Sunday" was on the Fourth Sunday of Lent. Long ago, people were freed from work to travel on this day to the parish where they were baptized, their "Mother Church." Often, people were reunited with their mothers on this day. Employers would release their workers and servants for this visit. The American celebration, while based on this custom, really has to do with an anti-war movement of mothers in Civil War times. They crusaded for better sanitary conditions for their sons. When President Wilson instituted the first Mother's Day in 1912, it was a day to fly the flag in honor of mothers whose children had died in battle. Knowing the tradition is a good balance to our celebration today. We can enfold in prayer the mothers who have suffered the loss of their children in war.

Q. I always wondered why we ask in the Lord's Prayer not to lead us into temptation, as though He sometimes did that. Can you please set me straight on this.

A. Gladly. Your theology is sounder than this part of the Lord's Prayer, though it has been recited with this phrasing by Catholics since the sixteenth century. The translation we still use was made by Henry VIII of England and imposed by him on all the churches in England. Even after Henry died and the troubles of the Reformation times abated the Catholics continued using his translation.

Henry did accurately translate the Greek and Latin forms. The mistake was made when the first written Greek Bible text did not perfectly translate the Aramaic language our Lord spoke. Matthew wrote down what He said, but in Hebrew for which we have no text. We may never know what exact words He used, but it is generally agreed now that He would not have attributed temptation (in the strict sense of provocation to sin) to His heavenly Father.

Most translators now argue that our Lord said something like "bring us not into trial," or "do not judge us." This makes very good sense and follows naturally from the previous petition, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." It is as though we were saying to God "And don't be strict about how well we succeed in forgiving those who hurt us."

The Church does not change the words of the **Our Father** because most people know them by heart, and it helps public recitation to have everyone saying the same words. But, of course, the Church allows scholars to use the results of new knowledge in writing new versions of the Scriptures. There are other inaccuracies in our form of the prayer: God is everywhere, not only "in heaven"; "daily bread" should be "bread for tomorrow" if you are to follow the Greek text, and so on. There is no end to amending the Scriptures as scholars achieve new discoveries and understandings, but it is better for most of us in daily prayer to proceed at a slower pace than the scholars.
